The special occasion for this year's World Food Day Colloquium (WFDC) is the 200th anniversary of the University of Hohenheim, founded in 1818 for generating knowledge on increasing food productivity after a great famine in Baden-Wuerttemberg, and the Raiffeisen Year 2018, in which the cooperative idea is celebrated on the occasion of the 200th birthday of its founder, Friedrich Wilhelm Raiffeisen.
